

Celebrate the risen Christ! **April 5 is Easter Sunday.**

Communique from Community Lay Director, Wally Athey

Each of you in the Arizona Walk to Emmaus community are probably well aware from where we get our name. On the Walk weekend, the Emmaus Road text from Luke 24:13-35 is read on Thursday evening as part of the Lay Director's first talk before going to the Chapel. And the story is told again as part of the evening devotion and reflection on Friday night with the aide of the "three dudes" statues. Luke's Emmaus road experience takes place on the first Easter afternoon when the risen Christ appears to the two disciples and explains to them all the scripture concerning himself.

However, it is not until Jesus took bread, blessed and broke it and gave it to them that their eyes were opened and they recognized the risen savior. They were changed in that moment. And this change prompted them to return to their friends to share the good news. The same change can take place on a Walk weekend.

During a recent Board of Director's meeting, our Community Spiritual Director, Rev. Jim Ek, reminded each of us that communion should always bring about change. He said, "If you're not changed when you receive communion, it has lost its significance for you. It is in remembering the sacrifice communion represents that we are called to change ourselves and change the world in which we live." Rev. Ek urged each of us to look for that change and to recognize it when it occurs.

Over the past two-plus decades I've been part of this movement I've never been to a team meeting, Walk weekend, Gathering, Candlelight or Closing worship where communion wasn't offered. In my weekly Group Reunion, receiving communion during the last week is always my "2. Closest to Christ" moment. I feel confident of the change communion has brought to my life, but I may have always recognized it. Now I'm consciously looking for it.

My prayer for each of you during this Easter season and beyond is to be changed through communion with God and to proclaim the mystery of faith, "Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again. Alleluia."

Reversal of Fortune

My wife and I have been in a Bible study over the past 9 weeks. It is Beth Moore's series on Esther. Now, I've read Esther many times. Mostly, it's been because I didn't remember some of the details of the Jewish festival of Purim.

Beth is a bit of a drama queen. She does that for a reason. You see, the way I have always read scripture is to find out what God was trying to tell me. Coming out of a rules based upbringing and spiritual training, I was mostly looking for rules or procedures or paths to follow.

Beth doesn't do that! She brings the message to life and expands the least little things to bring out the flavor and excitement of both the First (old) and Second (new) Testament. And in Esther, Beth helps us to 'wonder' about the reversal of fortunes as we experience the 'wonder' of living a life of exceeding grace.

The name, Purim, comes from the word 'Pur' or lot. The story starts out with Haman casting 'Pur' to figure out when to destroy all the Jews. According to scripture, "The lot fell on the twelfth month, the month of Adar." That's our February/March timeframe. Well, to get the whole story, read Esther. That's where we find that the Jews prevailed because the tables were turned and thus Purim is celebrated on the 14th and 15th day of Adar. That was March 4th and 5th of 2015.

So, why do I bring that up? Well, we have our own reversal (among many) when Saul of Tarsus, the enemy of the Jesus movement, experienced one of the greatest reversals in history. (Well, it was for us.) He flipped from persecutor to promoter and started calling himself Paul (which was a Greek rather than Jewish name).

James, the brother of Jesus, watched this new figure on the forefront of Christianity and was very suspicious; even alarmed! (Don't you get it?! This Saul guy was chief enemy! He wanted to see you and me suffer and die!) How can we trust a man who had previously been dedicated to our destruction?!

The rest of the story is history (albeit, a very exciting one if you read it again)! What I find interesting is that the Walk to Emmaus program is designed to do the same thing that Saul did - start a fire under burned-out believers! And, for some who have never been on an Emmaus weekend, sat in true Christian community, and experienced the grace that God offers us daily in that community, the doubt is strong! Just go to the internet and look up 'Emmaus'. There will be both pro and con statements. People 'doubt' our integrity, our intention, our love.

Beth Moore pointed out one interesting fact about 'Pur' or 'lot'. The Hebrew word has other uses in scripture. It is also used to indicate 'destiny.' What is your 'Pur' now that you have experienced the grace of God?

In Esther, there is no mention of God. But one must wonder how it is that the Jews have endured, even thrived, all these millennia if not for the 'destiny' God has provided. Now there's faithfulness... Praise be to our Almighty, Everlasting, and Loving God!
