Effective with the February Walks, the charge for the weekend will be \$95-which includes a deposit of \$20. We will also ask team members to contribute \$55. We are asking that these fees be paid by the time of registration on the Thursday night of the Walks. Scholarships are still available. Even with this rise in fees, we will be just barely covering the cost of the weekend.

Our plan is to keep the fee as low as we possibly can. As equipment ages, it will need to be replaced. So, when that occurs, we will advise you of our needs and then ask for your help in these specific cases.
